TO ALL DRUM MAJORS

The 'Alliance' is no more. We are a new organization operating under a new name, The North American Scottish Drum Majors Association, and I have been, through your vote, selected to act as President. I apologise for the delay in penning this letter but events beyond my control have neccessitated it should be thus.

I make no speeches. I'm not going to tell you that I'm happy to be in the chair of the President because quite frankly I've been handed such a kettle of fish that you can't even begin to imagine.

I waited for the Bank Statements from the "Alliance" because even though we are a new organization with a new set of By-Laws we will still need to draw upon the "Alliance" account until our new Laws are in effect and until the new organization is recognised by law.

The Bank Statements came yesterday and I have to tell you that it will take some time before I can sort them out. They are to say the least in some dis-array. In order to bring the account from San Diego to a bank closer to my home I have to go to San Diego. It matters little to me whether you are a traditionalist or whether you prefer flourishing. What does matter is that

you are Scottish Drum Majors with a long history, a long heritage, and a long tradition. We, as bearers of history, heritage, and tradition cannot afford to let the side down!

Speeches over. In closing I appeal to you to become involved. Besides perfecting your own skills take a youngster under your wing, help him or her, teach them what you already know, teach them respect, teach them dignity, and, have them enroll in the North American Scottish Drum Majors Association.
