Cultural Outreach and Engagement:

A massed band, consisting of members from WUSPBA, EUSPBA, MWPBA, Canada, Australia, Northern Ireland, and Scotland, along with 16 international highland dancers, will represent the largest piping and drumming presence in the parade since its inception. This opportunity will reach 750,000 people on the street and 24 million people via television and internet. "Pipes on Parade" is also performing at Disneyland on New Year's Eve and will perform a tattoo-style set at Pasadena City College on December 30th as part of TORP's Bandfest. This marks the first time this style of performance will be featured at a scholastic marching band festival, introducing pipes & drums to several thousand marching band students from home and abroad. If you will be in Southern California during this time, I encourage you to attend this groundbreaking event and support them.

As several of us pass the torch to the incoming WUSPBA leadership, I hope the association will continue to thrive and contribute even more. Our association needs strong minds with broad vision to continue building outreach, competition, and education. Pipe band associations are taking scrutiny these days, some of that very justified. My wish is that more people will get involved and encourage change from within.
